

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### UC DAVIS COOPERATIVE EXTENSION AT RISK FOR "BUDGET CUTS"

It seems everywhere we turn we are hearing concerns of budget cuts all over California. The 4-H Clubs are not immune to the budget cut crisis.

4-H is a prestigious youth organization that is a part of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, and the University of California system. We are under the division of Agriculture and Natural Resources (ANR), and this branches off into the Cooperative Extension Program. This program provides research and educational support to youth education programs throughout California. Locally we have a County 4-H Youth Development Office. Although 4-H is run through volunteer services, a large percentage is salary based. The University of California took significant cuts this year, and will need to make deeper cuts next year.

Most legislatures do not realize that 4-H is a part of the Cooperative Extension. Unless the legislature acts to reduce the cuts, the Extension will take a 30% budget cut.

#### HOW THIS AFFECTS OUR LOCAL CLUB:

The county 4-H can't survive without the paid staff. The number of staff in the whole state is minimal compared to our youth and volunteer membership. If legislators approve these cuts, the UC Cooperative Extension county-based advisors will be wiped out.

It's time for us, as members, parents and leaders, to become more informed about all 4-H has to offer, and inundate the community and state leaders with reasons why this cannot happen, and why this program as a part of the 4-H Youth Development Program is so very important to positive growth for our future.
